## Physics at Blackpool Pleasure Beach



In October Y11 students took part in a Physics Workshop at Blackpool Pleasure Beach.

Students took part in a workshop that explored the physics behind rollercoasters. The presentation took students on a journey through the process of concept and design of new rides and the steps to completion in Physics and Engineering as well as delving into technological advancements in communication which enable Blackpool Pleasure Beach to operate.

As part of the workshop, students learnt about the physics involved in rollercoaster engineering, from energy transfers to G-forces, to understand the real-life applications of physics and the construction of rollercoasters - from wooden classics to modern steel coasters.

Following the Physics session, students were then able to sample the rides and experience the physics for themselves.

KSGS's Karate superstar has won gold at a prestigious national event.

Year 11 pupil, Yanic Voican, took the title of English International Open Champion Cadet-57kg at the tournament in London in September.

Yanic also competes internationally, coming 7th out of a field of 30 competitors in Leige this month. He has also fought in tournaments in Berlin, Spain and Italy. He is part of the Northern regional team and the British squad and holds a black belt in the martial art.

Due to an injury in Leige, Yanic had to take a couple of weeks out but is back training hard at the Mitsuru Karate Club under sensei Mark Holding. His mum, Carla, said: "He doesn't give up, he keeps training hard to improve his position." Yanic has been practising karate since he was seven-years-old and has been fighting in competition, known as kumite, for the last three years. He also passes on his skills to those less experienced, teaching at Sedbergh Karate alongside his other senseis, Sharon Healey and Reece Healey.
