We are incredibly proud to share that Lillie Hoyle won the Cumbrian Young Writers' Award for Key Stage 3 with her captivating story about a girl lost at sea. The theme of this year's competition was 'Lost', and entries were submitted across four categories: KS2, KS3, KS4 and KS5. The theatre was filled with talented students, making Lillie's achievement even more impressive.



Throughout the day, we were inspired by a range of speakers. Author Sophie Anderson delivered a fascinating talk, and many of us were excited to recognise her work, with some of us already reading her books. We also learned about the journey from writing to publication from David Felton, who spoke passionately about the industry and introduced us to the many different careers involved in bringing books to life. It was especially interesting to hear about the local books he has published, many of which we recognised. We also received top writing tips through video messages from authors SF Said and Katie Hale, giving us valuable advice to support our own creative journeys.



The organiser of the event praised our group for the enthusiastic support we showed when Lillie received her award - we were all cheering her on! Adding to the celebrations, Miss Capstick was also recognised with an award for her dedication to encouraging and supporting our creative writing.

## Year 13 Chemists Visit Lancaster University

Our Year 13 Chemistry students recently enjoyed an inspiring visit to Lancaster University, where they took part in a hands-on Aspirin Masterclass alongside an interactive lecture exploring the shapes of molecules.

During the masterclass, students investigated how chemistry underpins everyday substances by taking a closer look at aspirin. They explored where physical, analytical and organic chemistry intersect, using a wide range of university-level techniques. Activities included using a pH meter to follow the titration of a weak acid with a strong base and graphically determining the pKa, before studying the titration of an Alka-Seltzer solution with hydrochloric acid. Students then isolated and analysed the resulting aspirin precipitate, gaining experience of a packed programme of analytical techniques including thin-layer chromatography (TLC), melting point determination and infrared spectroscopy (IR).

The visit also included an engaging and interactive talk on molecular shape and structure, where students had the opportunity to build models of molecules such as glucose and amino acids. They explored how these molecules can link together to form polymers and investigated the concept of optical isomerism, helping to bring challenging A-level concepts to life.

The day was both enjoyable and academically enriching, giving students a valuable insight into studying chemistry beyond school and the real-world applications of the subject.

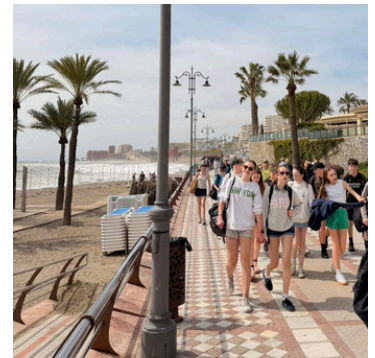
